

**Human Sexuality Advisory Committee
January 12, 2010, Meeting Minutes**

Members Present: Kerri Comai, Sherri Driscoll, Mary Jo Andrysiak, Gary Hall, Olivia Lawson, and Ed terSteeg.

With no public comment, the meeting was called to order at 1:50 P. M. by Ed terSteeg. The December 15, meeting minutes were acknowledged as presented.

HIV/AIDS Instruction - It was determined that all buildings are in compliance with the State of Michigan requirement by law that HIV/AIDS be taught in every building.

Scope and Sequence - Ed terSteeg reviewed the data gathered from all buildings regarding what is actually being taught by grade level. He suggested that with all the changes occurring this past year in terms of program changes (the Health class being moved to the 8th grade from the 9th) staff assignments, retirements, the third grade being relocated to Dunlap Elementary, six block scheduling at the high school, and some programs such as Teen Heart (7th Grade) no longer being an option that it is apparent that there needs to be some work done in grades 6, 7, 9, 10, 11, and 12.

Mary Jo Andrysiak will meet with Barry Duckham, High School Principal, to determine options both in school and with the potential help from outside agencies to consider in order to possibly "recapture" some of the human sexuality instruction that was lost due to all of the changes occurring at the high school. Additionally, Ed terSteeg will contact Christina Feneley, Middle School Principal, to determine options both in school and with the potential help from outside agencies to consider in order "recapture" some of the human sexuality instruction that was lost due to all of the changes occurring at the middle school. We will review the progress to date made regarding these two conversations at the February 9, committee meeting.

Kerri Comai shared her decision to resign at the end of the school year as the co-chair of the Human Sexuality Advisory Committee. "I have enjoyed my time on this committee and feel strongly of its importance." She indicated that due to an extremely busy schedule and a desire to increase her time volunteering in the classroom she decided to resign from the committee. The committee accepted Kerri's resignation with regret and thanked her for all the time she had committed to the advisory committee.

The next meeting is scheduled for February 9, at 1:45 pm in the High School Conference Room. Being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 2:40 P. M.
